Ordered, That the clerk inform the house of representa-

atives, that the said bill, which is the same as the bill introduced by Mr. Shaker of the 1st instant, was reported, and they were delivered to the enrollment to be presented to the Lieut. Gov. for his signature.

Mr. Garrard from the committee on William Webb, Esq; made a report favorable.

Resolved, That the senate do advise and consent to the nomination of the said Wm. Webb Esq; for county, and that messrs. Bartlett, J. Q. Garrard, &c, acquaint the Lt. Governor therewith.
