A Counterfeiter's Nest Disturbed.

The CINCINNATI COMMERCIAL of the 5th inst., gives the following account of a wholesale counterfeiting establishment and its operations during the past year, which has recently been discovered in the neighborhood of that city:

"Below we give a correct list of the impressions on counterfeit plates of various denominations on sundry Banks, taken from the book of a German, named Jacob Keller, who was, as he stated to the police, employed by Robert Neal, the

Boston Money and Stock Market.

BOSTON, FEB. 10, 1852.

Dear Sir:—The Money Market has assumed a more favorable aspect during the past week. The Boston Banks, notwithstanding the presence of the Legislative Bank Commissioners in State Street, have discounted quite freely. The first class business paper which has found its way into the street has been readily taken at from 7½ to 8 per cent, while many borrowers refuse to pay over 7 per ct. and hold their paper for a better market. Rail Road Notes are mostly rejected by the Banks, consequently, they are looked upon with distrust by most capitalists, and bring the highest price on the street.

The Stock Market has been unusually active, most of the "Fancies" having been sold largely at an advance on former quotations. The Norfolk County seems to have taken the lead, closing today at 15½. The Canton Company Stock has made

5s, on the **Hatters' Bank**, Bethel, Ct., altered from twos—man ploughing with two horses, boy on one of them.

2s, on the **Atlantic Bank**, Cape May, N. J. altered from ones—vig. sailor, anchor, capstan, &c. ships in distance.

2s, on the **State Bank of Ohio**, letter A—The lathe-work on left margin and head of Wm. Penn are poor—the right foot of the Indian in the vignette is poor, and looks more like a stump than a foot. The letters in the word CINCINNATI are crooked and irregular. The above gives the particular defects of the note—its general appearance is good, and very likely to pass unless closely scrutinized.

2s & 5s, on the **Pequonnock Bank**, Conn., altered from genuine ones—vig. three Indians on a cliff viewing town in distance—three men loading a grain wagon, with horse and oxen attached, on left end—not like genuine.

5s, on the **York Bank**, Pa.—have not seen them, but said to be poorly done—in the engraver's name, "Bald" is spelt "Balb."

5s, on the **Framingham Bank**, Mass.—Vig. Mercury, large ship, horn of plenty, anchor, sheaf of grain, &c., with round die and figure 5—on right end, figure 5, young girl, and FIVE—on left end, figure 5, blacksmith, and FIVE.

5s, on the **Windham Bank**, Mass.—Vig. Mercury, large ship, horn of plenty, anchor, sheaf of grain, &c., with round die and figure 5—on right end, figure 5, young girl, and FIVE—on left end, figure 5, blacksmith, and FIVE.

5s, on the **State Bank**, Hartford, Ct., altered from genuine ones.

10s, on the **Merchants' Bank**, New Haven, altered from genuine ones—vig. three females. The genuine TENS have no female figures, except a bathing girl between the signatures.

10s, on the **Carroll Co. Bank**, Conn., altered from a "Michigan wild cat"—vig. three females, a griffin on a safe, with 10 in large die each side—unlike genuine, but well calculated to deceive.

10s, on the **Bank of the South County**, Rhode Island, altered from genuine ones—seem to have been done with a pen.

10s, on the **Farmers' & Merchants' B'k.** Baltimore—female with key, shield, &c.—a large female, eagle, goblet, &c., on left end—anchor, female, &c., on right end—plough and sheaf of grain between the signatures.

2s, on the **Farmers' Bank** of Lancaster, Pa. A large amount of these are circulating in Maryland—see page 21.

—There was found on the Turnpike Road in Hardy County, Va., a few days since, a large bundle of new counterfeit notes, chiefly five and ten dollars on the **York Bank**, and **Middletown Bank**, Pa. The York ten and the Middletown fives are pretty well executed, and well calculated to deceive. The York fives are badly engraved, and in the engraver's name, the name Bald is spelt "Balb."

Keller states that the number of impressions during 1849, was considerably more than those of 1850 and 1851. Neal manufactured the above at his splendid residence, fifteen miles from this city, and two miles from Mt. Carmel, and, receiving information that the officers were suspicious of his business, suddenly left for parts unknown, a few weeks ago, since which time diligent exertions have been made to ascertain his whereabouts, but without avail. Keller also states that Neal has been engaged in counterfeiting money for a number of years, and realized by this villanous business a very large amount. He owns a large amount of property—one of the finest vineyards in the Western country, splendid stock, and has now a large surplus of cash on hand. The premises of Neal have not yet been searched, nor do we know, indeed, that they will be, as it is highly probable that all and everything that would lead to his detection and conviction, aside from the acknowledgment of Keller, has been removed and concealed. Keller, whose statement is corroborated by other facts, known only to the police, entertaining fears that he also would be arrested and convicted, has left, as is supposed, for California. He assured his counsel that what he stated was true to the letter, but to make himself safe he thought it advisable to leave for parts now best known to himself. No. 1.

10s, imitation of genuine 10s of the MINER'S BANK, Pa. Vignette, a female with an anchor by her side, and vessels in the distance—the word TEN on the corners—a head of a female on the side, and a small coat of arms of Pennsylvania at the bottom.

No. 2.

10s, centre vignette, steamboat, sail vessels, &c.—Washington on the right end, and the word TEN on the left end.

No. 3.

10s, centre vignette, a locomotive and train of cars, with a frightened horse;—on right end a female in a sitting posture, the figure "10" in the upper, and the word TEN in the lower corner—on the left end a sailor with quadrant, &c., small state arms above, and the word TEN below him.

No. 4.

5s, altered from a broken Michigan Bank, centre vignette, a female holding a key, and receiving a bag of coin from the hands of Mercury, a griffin seated on a chest at her side—on the right end are two females, and on the left end one female with scales, &c.

No. 5.

5s, in the centre of the note is a large figure "5" in a "medallion, to the right of which is a man harrowing, and to the left a man ploughing, —between the names of

The Counterfeit \$2 Notes on the Harrisburgh Bank, Pa.

A new counterfeit two dollar bill on the Harrisburgh Bank, Pa., has recently been put in circulation. It is an imitation of the new plate of the re-issues of that Bank. The engraving and general appearance of the note, as a whole, at the first glance, is good, but when closely examined and compared with the genuine, the difference is at once apparent. They are best detected, perhaps, by examining the main engraving at the bottom of the note, and particularly, the faces of the three men thereon, which are coarsely executed and badly imitated. The engraving, as a whole, is blacker than the genuine, and the paper, which is in most cases, the best detector, is harder, paler, and thinner. They are, however, sufficiently well executed to give them a ready circulation in the community.

The large shipments of Specie, amounting to nearly one million, and making two millions within the week, rather abated the disposition to lock up spare funds, in a y but short dated securities. The effect of these shipments will not be permanent. Nothing further will go, at least, for ten days, and the market to-day shows an easier feeling. The Galveston News furnishes a synopsis of a Bill which it describes as having passed both Houses of the Legislature of Texas, providing for the payment and liquidation of the public debt. The bill appropriates two out of the \$5,000,000 bonds, to pay certain accumulated debts immediately. The debts are scaled and classified under sixteen heads. The immediate payments ordered are, of those under the third head of that classification, \$226,002 for ten per cent. funded debt of February 5, 1840; the fourth head, \$7,248 for eight per cent funded debt of February 5, 1840; the ninth, \$69,451 for audited paper—various enactments; the tenth, \$26,129 for miscellaneous liabilities; the fourteenth, \$679,222 for second class debt; the fifteenth, \$16,467 for third class debt, lately admitted as second; sixteenth, \$72,077, less \$38,053, amount acknowledged by joint resolution. These appropriations amount to \$1,058,542—leaving \$841,457 unappropriated, specifically. This is to go into a fund for the payment of claims embraced under the second class of debts, being the class for which the impost duties were not pledged. Specific appropriations, out of the five millions of reserved bonds which the United States keeps yet in its custody, are made for the following debts, numbered as in the same classification, thus:

1. \$442,768 for the ten per cent consolidated fund of June 7th, 1837.
2. \$7,970 for ten per cent fund of same year, for the relief of Swartwout and others.
5. \$153,360 for eight per cent treasury bonds, of 1840.
6. \$41,630 for 10 per cent treasury notes of 1837.
7. \$965,685 for ten per cent treasury notes of 1837, second issue.
8. \$457,048 for treasury notes, without interest, of 1837.
11. \$400,000 for the bond issued from the United States Bank; \$97,950 for purchase of steamer ZAVALLA; \$140,000 for naval vessels contracted for with F. Dawson.
12. \$1,468,153 for interest on above.
13. \$113,664 for additional interest by act of 1850.

These appropriations amount to \$2,506,411 of principal, and \$1,581,819 of interest. Total, \$4,088,220—leaving \$911,780 of the reserved five millions, which is added to the \$941,457 surplus from the two million fund—making \$1,853,237, which is directed to be appropriated solely for the second class debts. Only two millions are appropriated of the bonds immediately receivable; the other three millions are reserved, apparently, for other uses than the payment of debts scaled, or otherwise.

All the free Banks in Michigan appear to be in a flourishing condition. The official report of the State Treasurer gives returns from each Bank, made up to the close of December, 1851. The annexed Statement exhibits the condition of the GOVERNMENT STOCK BANK at that time:

the left a man ploughing, —between the names of the officers is a mechanic's arm and hammer. This is an alteration, probably from a fraudulent Wisconsin bank plate, and the engraving being good, is well calculated to pass through the hands of those who are not good judges of money.

No. 6.

5s. centre vignette, a female (Justice) resting on a short column, holding a sword and scales in her hands—each side of the vignette, a square die, containing a large letter "V,"—on each end margin, a female holding a rake in one hand and a sprig of grain in the other, with the figure "3" in each corner of the note,—the FIVE occurs five times on the top and five times on the bottom margin. It bears the imprint of "Draper Underwood, Bald & Spencer."

No. 7.

3s. centre vignette, a female standing beside a shield containing an eagle, surrounded by emblems of agriculture and art, with a ship, &c. On the left end a scroll containing a figure 3. On the right end a ship under sail, with the word THREE on the upper and lower corner.

No. 8.

3s. altered from the broken Citizens' Bank, Augusta, Maine,—vignette, a shield containing an anchor, and an eagle on the top supported by two females, one holding a rake, and the other a sword and scales, with a canal, bridge, small horses, &c., in the distance—each side of vignette a round die containing a female's and a child's head—a female on each end, with the

ing. It being settling day the Banks are less liberal in their discounts, but the now numerous private banking houses afford an unabated abundance for borrowers. The rates of discount are still 6@7 per cent for prime and good names, and 5@6 per cent for Call Loans.

The PACIFIC brings four days later news (to the 28th ult.) from Europe. American Breadstuffs were active at an advance on former quotations. Cotton was all life and animation at an advance, in consequence of much reduced estimates of the coming crops. The Paris Money Market was unsettled. Five per cents were 101f. 85c., and the Three per cents 64f. The Paris correspondent of the *Morning Chronicle*, says Louis Napoleon intends war on England.

The Foreign Exchange Market closed very firm for the steamer of Wednesday, at 10¼ for Sterling, with but little doing at higher rates, though 10½@10¾ were asked by several houses, who did not care to sell. Francs were steady at 5.13¾@ \$5.15. Since Wednesday the market is inactive, and prices are nominal. It is anticipated that the demand will not be so heavy next steamer day, and if the supply of bills improve as many suppose it must do, the rates will then be less firm.

The Stock Market has been active, especially for the Fancies, though less so to-day.

The speculation in Reading, and Delaware and Hudson Canal continues active, and prices have considerably advanced. The last named Stock, however, lost a fraction of its gain to-day, and closes at 116, which is extravagantly high for a six per cent. stock. Operators, however, are speculating on higher dividends, resulting from a rise in the Coal Market, which, as it can only be temporary, is a very unsubstantial base to operate on. Erie is very steady. The large operators have disappeared from the market, yet the stock is well sustained.

The prospects are very good, and we think we can depend on a steadier market for a longer period of time than we could last year.

— An application is making to the Legislature to enlarge the range of securities for Savings' Banks investment. The following is the proposed law:

SEC. 1. It shall be lawful for any Savings' Bank, organized under or incorporated by the laws of this State, in addition to the powers heretofore granted, to invest any money they have received, or hereafter shall receive, as deposits, in the stock or bonds of any city in the State of New-York, which may be issued under the authority of the Legislature of this State, or to loan said money on the securities of any stock or bonds in which said corporation is authorized to invest the same; provided, that the amount loaned thereon shall not exceed ninety per cent of the market value thereof.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

— The bill allowing Virginia Sixes to be deposited by Banks as securities for circulating notes, has passed to a third reading in the New Jersey Legislature.

— Several new Banks are being organized by New-York capital, under the Illinois Free Banking Law.

The total amount of Gold from California received at the Mints, in 1851, was \$55,938,232, a sum which has far exceeded the estimates made early in the year; the highest of which was \$50,000,000. This year the estimate is over \$75,000,000, with some probability of reaching even \$100,000,000, if scientific methods are extensively adopted in reducing and separating the quartz deposits.

Important to Banks and Bankers.

The following important case to Bankers and others has been decided in the Superior Court of Massachusetts.

Western Bank vs. John Mills, of Springfield.— This was a suit to recover amount of notes (\$18,000) given by Dean, Packard & Mills, and endorsed by defendant. Payment was resisted on the ground of illegal proceedings in the manner of discounting the notes by the Bank, and also because of usury. The plaintiff was non-suited, that is, the objections of the defendant were sustained. The facts of the arrangement between the Bank and Dean, Packard & Mills, who have become insolvent, were briefly that the former were to discount for them to the amount of \$18,000, on condition that \$3000 of the sum should be kept permanently on deposit—in other words, that the Bank was to receive interest on \$18,000, and loan out \$15,000. By the failure of their suit to recover of the endorser, it is supposed that the Bank will lose about \$13,000, having collateral securities which will cover a portion of the loan.—*Springfield Republican.*

— The New Orleans Banks are well fortified with Specie. By the returns made up to the 24th January last, we have the following statement, showing an excess of Specie over the circulation:

REVIEW OF THE NEW-YORK MARKETS.

THURSDAY EVENING, Feb. 12, 1852.

We have a grateful change to announce. The markets for Cotton and Breadstuffs are become more active, and a better export demand prevails. In Cotton, however, this has been at the cost of a small concession in price, but Flour and Wheat have advanced considerably. The shipments of Flour are larger this week. The recent consignments of Wheat to Liverpool have realized a very handsome profit. The receipts by Railroad are also improving, and the rising market is gradually bringing supplies from the interior, which will benefit our Dry Goods trade, now commencing to be active.

ASHES—We notice rather more inquiry the past week for Pots for export, at full prices. Pearls

are somewhat irregular in price and the stock much diminished. The Stock consists of 200 bbls. Pearls and 4420 bbls. Pots, in the Inspection Warehouse.

BEE SWAX—A moderate business has been done since our last for export, sales of 4,760 lbs. Fair to Prime Yellow, 25@26c cash.

COAL—Our market for Domestic is lower. The opening of all the Southern rivers has increased the supply in prospect, and the market is dull. Foreign is not plenty but the market is dull at quotations.

COFFEE—The trade are buying freely, which keeps the market very steady. Rio, Laguayra, Maracaibo, St. Domingo and Java are alike active at our quotations. St. Domingo is mostly taken for export at 7½c cash.

COTTON—The demand has become active since the arrival of the EUROPA's mail from Liverpool. The advance anticipated not having occurred in that market, holders conceded ¼c. and shippers immediately took hold. Consumption is active in the manufacturing districts, and as stocks are light, prices cannot materially recede. There is an increased consumption also this season among our own manufacturing interests. The crop will probably yield 2,800,000 bales. At the Gulf ports the receipts have been large and in excess of last year, so, also, at Charleston, but at Mobile the receipts have been retarded by the low state of the rivers. The probability is, that prices will neither rise or fall to any great extent; perhaps the extreme and continued caution with which shippers buy may keep the market rather on the decline, as holders become impatient. The keeping stock for any length of time is more expensive than any slight concession insisted on by buyers.

DRUGS AND DYES—Turkey Opium has advanced. Sales have been made at \$4.25@4.37½, and is now held higher. Large sales of Bi Carbonate of Soda have been made, to arrive, at 4½c. French Madder is scarce and wanted. Sal Soda, to arrive, sells at \$1.80c. Mexican Cochineal is held higher than the last sales, which were at 85c. The demand for Drugs has considerably improved this week, and our revised quotations are readily realized.

DRY GOODS—The trade is much more active. The auction sales increase. The first Carpet sale of the season took place yesterday, but the prices obtained are low. The stocks of all Staple Goods are very large, but at present are firmly held. The Sale of Prints, both Foreign and Domestic is very

and the advanced pretensions of holders. This demand has been induced by the late favorable foreign advices and the admitted small stock of all kinds, now generally held by two or three houses. Prices have advanced three to six cents per bushel, with an active inquiry, in part for the European Continent, prices having advanced more in France and Germany than in Liverpool and London. Canadian is now in the hands of one house, and is not offered, and but little has been done since our last; any quotation must be taken as nominal. There has been an active demand for Southern White and Red, to arrive, which have been sought after in preference to other kinds for export, and has partaken more of the upward movement. At the close, the market was quite unsettled and prices variable. Rye has fluctuated considerably, closing dull and heavy at the decline. Barley has been in better demand, and is now held more firmly, with, however, few transactions to note. Barley Malt commands \$1.00 in lots, and is not plenty—the receipts of both are limited, and the stock is fair. Oats have come to market more freely, and prices have declined, and the tendency is still downward, with large receipts in prospect. Corn has gradually assumed firmness, and has been in good demand for export, with more doing for the East and local trade, with considerable sales of Southern, to arrive for export—the prospective arrivals check the upward tendency. The stock is small of Old, and there is now but little New here.

HAY—The supply is large and the market is heavy; sales of 1,600 Bales, River, for shipping at 74@78c cash.

HOPS—A very limited inquiry for both Eastern and Western, and the market is heavy; sales of 25 Bales, in lots, at 26@30c, and by the single Bale, at 2@4c higher price.

HIDES—Continue to strengthen in price. Buenos Ayres, 20½c, 21 lbs., sells readily at 13½c. Some lots in Boston sold at 13c to come here; 2,600 heavy weights brought 12c to go South. Orinoco is held 12½c; the Stock is 45,000, and 10,000 African.

LEAD—Spanish and English have been in demand for re-export, at \$3.72½@3.75, in bond. Missouri is held firmly at our highest quotation; 200 tons Spanish, to arrive coastwise, sold at \$4.37½@4.44.

LEATHER—is in steady moderate demand, which takes up all receipts. The stock is light and prices are firm. Some further shipments of heavy weights, Hemlock Sole, for England, have been made at 11c.

OILS—Whale has become scarce. The stock is only 200 barrels, held at 60c. The last sales were at 58c. Linseed Oil is dull at 62@63c, in whole parcels, though from one manufacturing house it can be bought in small lots only at 61@62c, the latter price for barrels. Red Oil is firm at 41c.

PROVISIONS—Our market for Pork, since our last weekly review, has been more active with a good local and shipping demand, together with a speculative inquiry for Old Mess, which has improved more than New, the stock being so very light. The advices from the West, and from New Orleans, have imparted buoyancy to the market, and the late news from Europe has added strength

obtained are low. The stocks of all Staple Goods are very large, but at present are firmly held. The Sale of Prints, both Foreign and Domestic is very large on the increase at full prices. Cotton goods are very firm, Browns rather buoyant. Delaines are hardly active yet. Cloths and Cassimeres are moderately active at regular prices. The Clothiers are still buying. Dress Goods of all kinds are in brisk demand. Jaconets, Plaid Ribbons, Fine Silks, Colored, Black and Plain, all sell well at full prices. The imports are yet light, and seasonable goods (not Staple) are very firm. The exports of Domestic Goods are larger than last year, being 221 against 156, as compared with February, 1851, for the first ten days. China Goods are in overstock, and prices are heavy. A public sale at the close of last week revealed this unpleasant fact to the holders. The goods offered—Crape Shawls and Fine Silks, brought very low prices.

FLOUR AND MEAL—We hear of some large sales of State, deliverable on the opening of the Hudson, at \$4.50@4.75. Our late advices from the Continent of Europe have given strength to the market, and private advices are more favorable than the published accounts. In France, the last crop of Breadstuffs is only three-quarters of an average one, and prices have advanced. In Liverpool there is a good export demand for the North of Europe; this, with the admitted stock, had induced a speculative inquiry. Our stock here is light, and the receipts on the opening of the River, it is said will not exceed 45,000 barrels. The better grades have partaken of the improvement. Of the sales of the week some 35 or 40,000 barrels have been for export. Canadian is now in the hands of one house, and is not offered, some small sales have been made at the Railroad depot at \$4.75. The stock is now 13,000 barrels. Southern has been active and advanced with some large sales to arrive, mostly for export. There has been a better demand for the West Indies and for the home trade, at 18¼@25c advance, and the tendency is still upward; the arrivals in prospect are large. Our stock of Southern is very limited; the arrivals from New Orleans have increased, but are not sufficient to affect the market, and this description is much wanted for the home trade and for export. Corn Meal has ruled very firm at the advance last noticed, with little or nothing here, and more has been done to arrive. Rye Flour has varied but little—it is quite scarce and is in limited request at our quotations. Buckwheat Flour has ruled firm, and is in fair demand at \$2.12@2.37½ pr 100 lbs. and \$4.62½@5.00 pr bbl.

FISH—The market is more active, and prices have advanced for Cod and Mackerel. Gibbed Herring has sold, to arrive, at \$3.50@3.62½.

FEATHERS—There has been a better demand since our last, with sales of 6,000 lbs. good to prime Western, within our quotations.

FLAX—There has been more inquiry for Jersey of both, but the sales are moderate at our figures.

GRAIN—Since our last weekly notice of the Wheat market there has been a strong upward movement, with an active demand for milling and for export, restricted only by the absence of stock

light. The advices from the West, and from New Orleans, have imparted buoyancy to the market, and the late news from Europe has added strength to it. The home trade has improved since the opening of the Eastern Sound, and there has been a better demand for the West Indies, which has reduced our stock of new material. There is very little change to note in Prime, it has been in better request. Clear is held higher and is in fair demand, \$16.25@16.37½. Sour Mess is held \$14.75, and do. Prime, \$11.75@12. New Rumps are held, at \$14; Prime Mess is without inquiry and is nominal, \$15.50. Old Mess is selling at \$15.50 in small lots, and do. Prime at \$13.62½@13.75. Beef has been very active for the trade, and there has been more done for the West Indies at improved prices; the Stock is light and the tendency still upward. Old Beef has been in request, with sales of Prime at \$3, Mess \$5.00@5.50. Prime Mess is quiet but firm, at \$16@17. Beef Hams have been in better demand, and prices are better with a light stock and buoyant market, the demand being good at the close. Lard is less firm—the supply is better, exceeding the demand. The late favorable foreign advices have impaired no firmness to the market, the current prices here being above those of Liverpool, and the demand has been confined mostly to the home trade and the West Indies. Pickled Meats have been ordered more freely, and have ruled firm, with a good demand for the local trade. Nothing has been done in Dry Salted for export as yet. Bacon is without inquiry, and quotations are nominal at 7¼@9c. Dressed Hogs continue in limited supply, and are selling only to the retail trade at 7@8c. Butter has been in demand for the home trade and the East, and with a light stock, prices have improved. Cheese is more saleable, and is held higher, the stock being very small of good.

RICE—Is in fair demand for export. The sales for the week are 900 tierces at \$3.18¼@3.37½c. Prime is scarce.

SUGARS—The trade is buying largely, and prices are firm. Box Sugars have sold at 5c, for a whole cargo, and in lots at 4¼@5½c. New Orleans and Cuba Muscovado sold at our quotations. Some new crop Brazil brought 4¼c, less 3 per cent for refining. Stocks are large in all the Atlantic markets.

TALLOW—There is more inquiry for export; sales of 115,000 lbs. Fair to Prime, 7¼@8¾c.

TEAS—Are active. One auction sale has been held this week, and the advance obtained last week on Oolongs, Twankays, Young Hysous and Skins, has been fully maintained. The demand is good and holders are firm.

TOBACCO—The home demand is fair at steady prices. Kentucky mostly sells at 4¼ up to 8c. Seed Leaf has been active, at 8¼@12½c for Connecticut, and 11c for Pennsylvania, Havana at 37½c, and Florida at 10@21c. Manufactured is still quiet.

WOOL—The market is active and prices very firm; 50,000 lbs. Domestic Fleece sold during the week at 37c up to 43c, mostly at 40c. Super and Extra Pulled Wools are scarce, the former has sold at 38c, and the latter at 42@45c.



It is done by pasting the figures 3, 5, 10, &c., over 1's or 2's, and the words expressing the original value of the bill, such as One, Two, &c., are defaced (or sometimes erased by the aid of acids,) and the fictitious value substituted. These are frauds we do not pretend to keep the run of, as no genuine bill is exempt from its practice. When we hear of them we insert them in the List.

How to Detect the above Frauds.

Hold the bill to the light, when the parts PASTED will appear DARK and THICK, (for if erased by acids THIN and WORN) if not able to detect in this way, moisten that part of the note around the figures 3, 5, 10, &c., with water, and the pasted parts will appear darker and thicker.
