BANK COMMISSIONERS REPORT.

Detroit, June 12th 1837.

To his Excellency STEVENS T. MASON,
Governor of Michigan:

Sir—In accordance with your instructions I have visited all the Banking Institutions in the State, and made a personal examination into their affairs; and have the honor to submit the accompanying statements as the result of my inquiries into their present condition.

It is due to the Banks and to the community that I should express my entire conviction of their general solvency, and ability 'o meet their existing liabilities; I do this with great pleasure, as the exhibits of their present situation herewith communicated fully demonstrate, that the Banks of Michigan were under no necessity to suspend specie payments, except as a measure of defence, to protect themselves from the consequences that must inevitably result from the suspension of the Banks in New York and elsewhere.

I will also take the occasion to say that every facility has been afforded me by the officers of the different Banks in aid of my investigation, and every disposition manifested to give a true exposition of their affairs. All which is respectfully submitted.
