


Number of HUD 184 Loans by Type of Land (1995-2015)


Fee Land Loans Dominate Since 2005





Use of HUD 184 Mortgages on Trust Land








Native Americans were disproportionately searched after being stopped by police in Minneapolis





CICD's Reservation Profiles















