Cotton.—The arrivals since the 27th have been by steamboats and waggon 1: bales, and exported to Havana 210 bales leaving on hand and on ship-board. cleared, a stock of 6811 bales.

There has been a further decline in Cotton Market since our last, but from great irregularity of the whole week's business, it is difficult to state the precise amount. Most of the purchases made were for northern manufactories and for immediate use and it is said many are now in hand, limited below present rates. On Europe account, orders to any considerable extent could not now be executed, even if the market were sufficiently stocked, for the reason that our present reduced rates are considered 1/2 a 3/4 c. above the Liverpool market. The late foreign news has had an injurious effect upon the market, and until the question of war is settled, extensive orders cannot be expected only at very low rates. In fact, it has been mentioned to us that several foreign orders had been countermanded by the last arrival, unless purchases could be effected on much better terms. The sales of the week are estimated at about 16 bales, at rates ranging from 6 1/2 to 9 1/4 c.; according to actual transactions, we quote fair Cotton at 9 a 9 1/4, and good fair at 9 1/2. The stock on the Market is computed at 900 to 1000 bales.

Bagging and Rope.—The same obstacle to an active Market, noted in our last, still continues—low rivers; though we observe considerable improvement in inquiry, as we have heard of sales of several small lots of Kentucky on short time; effected at rates however, rather under our time figures last week—one lot at 32 a 15, one at 33 a 1, and one at 32 a 15c. We have heard of transactions for cash, and retain previous asking rates, remarking that on 90 day former-time rates would probably be maintained. Agreeably to these transactions, we quote for cash and on time, Kentucky bagging 31 a 33 cents; Alabama 31 a 33; Ind 30 a 32; Brigg's 25 a 27; Dundee 22 a 30c the two latter ranging according to quality. Rope, Ky., 12 1/2 a 1 1/4; Northern 8 a 11 cent Received since 28th ult., 790 pieces bagging and 1452 coils rope.

Bacon.—The stock is fair, and we quote Canvassed Hams 14 a 14 1/2 cents; uncavvassed none; Sides 11 a 11 1/2; Shoulders 9 a 9 1/2. Received this week 28 casks.

Flour.—We quote Western Superfine at \$6 a \$6 1/2 per bbl. Northern is held at \$6 a \$6 1/2, with little inquiry. Receipts 769 bbl.

GRAIN.—We observe some improvement in the rates for Corn, and quote 70 a 75 per bushel; Oats 50 a 55c. Received since 28th ult., 484 sacks Corn, and 1703 Oats.

LARD.—The demand is limited at 15 a 15 1/2 cents. Received 156 kegs.

MOLASSES.—We have no alteration to note in asking rates from last week, and still quote 26 a 28 cents, remarking that a good article would command something over these figures. Sales at auction have been made this week at 23 cents.
