

- Perry Preschool
 - \$16 to \$1
- Abecedarian Educational Child Care
 \$4 to \$1
- Chicago-Child Parent
 \$10 to \$1
- Elmira Prenatal/Early Infancy Project
 \$5 to \$1

Home visiting program for growth-stunted young children shows long-term benefits Based on randomized control trials

- Jamaica. Age 22.
 - Higher education attainment, reduced crime, and 25% higher earnings
- Replication in Colombia. Post-program (age 3 and 4).
 - Stronger cognition and receptive language
- Replication underway in India.

Early Learning Scholarships – White Earth Reservation Year 2 Report Summary

- Selected families with the highest need, 144 children
- Scholarships linked with parent mentor and child development trainings
- Scholarships were incentive for programs to enroll in the Parent Aware quality rating system
- Scholarships enabled programs to increase quality and serve more low-income families and children with special needs
