- Shift from prior local measurement to using common tools and methods








Support for Analysis and Use



Over 87 % of survey respondents indicated they are satisfied with life in their Center City neighborhood.

Value to Participants

- Reconnect with "why" of work
- Engage with community
- Using baseline data locally:
 - Influence programs and strategies
 - Engaging with residents
 - Dispelling myths/telling a new story
 - Building allies/partnerships
 - Leveraging resources

A Few Lessons

- Be attentive to the value proposition for participating organizations (WIIFM)
- Build from existing practice
- Don't short-change the up-front engagement and mission alignment
- Allow some add-on beyond shared core
- Focus on local use as well as collective use
- Focus on learning
