


Steady job growth post-pandemic


Minnesota, Seasonally Adjusted

- Minnesota ranked 19th among states in unemployment rate
- Minnesota has long had an unemployment rate below the national average

Minnesota, Seasonally Adjusted



Strong labor force participation, ranking 6th

- Minnesota ranked 6th among states in labor force participation rate
- Minnesota has long been a leader in participation, but we still have not returned to pre-pandemic levels due to retirements



Strong growth in Construction, Edu & Health Svc, Trade Transp & Utilities




Over the Year Percent Change in Jobs


Over-the-Year job growth ranks 24th in nation

- Minnesota ranked 24th among states in over the year job growth
- Supersectors that outperformed national average:
 - Construction up 5.3% compared to 2.6% nationally
 - Trade, Transportation, and Utilities 2.8% compared to 0.3% nationally
 - Education & Health Services up 4.8%, compared to 4.2% nationally
- Supersectors that underperformed the national average:
 - Professional & Business Services down 2.0%, while the U.S. grew 0.9%
 - Financial Activities down 4.0%, while the U.S. grew 0.6%
 - Manufacturing down 1.6%, while the U.S. grew 0.2%




Fewer Workers Per Job Vacancy Than National Average

- Minnesota ranked 19th among states in unemployed workers per job vacancy
- This ratio is a good indicator of labor market tightness




Wage Growth and Inflation Over-the-Year Change, Minnesota and U.S.




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Minnesota's Average Earnings Higher

Takeaways

- Average job growth over the past year
- Low unemployment rate, 3.1%
- Minnesota's labor force has been slow to bounce back after the pandemic
- High labor force participation, 68.3%
- Some supersectors thrive, others experience job loss
- 2 job vacancies per job seeker
- Slow wage growth, high earning/hour
